

Transfer of Community Health Services in Manchester

The responsibility for running community health services in Manchester is set to change on 1st April 2011 as part of the Government's Transforming Community Services (TCS) programme, subject to final agreement.

The aim of the national TCS programme is to secure greater effectiveness and efficiencies in community services so that they can provide modern personalised and responsive care of a consistently high standard.

In Manchester, community health services will transfer from NHS Manchester (Manchester Primary Care Trust) and be split across and merged into four main NHS organisations - the city's three hospital Trusts: Central Manchester University Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust, Pennine Acute Hospitals NHS Trust, University Hospital of South Manchester NHS Foundation Trust, and Manchester Mental Health & Social Care NHS Trust.

In addition, two community health services - Dermatology Clinical Assessment and Treatment Service and Tier 2 Epilepsy – will transfer to Salford Royal NHS Foundation Trust. Port Health and the Interpretation Service will remain with NHS Manchester.

This is largely an administrative change and patients who receive community health services are unlikely to experience any changes in the way these services are provided. Community health services will continue to be based at health centres and clinics. Patients' medical records will be securely transferred to the new NHS organisations providing those services and will remain confidential to them.
